

# animago AWARD: Here come the 2016 nominees! A total of 39 projects in 13 categories chosen from 1,076 entries

Munich, 24 August 2016: Last week, an independent jury of experts drawn from 14 different fields chose the final nominees for this year's animago AWARD. After days of deliberation, they nominated the three best works in each of the 13 animago categories. This year, a total of 1,076 projects were submitted for consideration from 58 nations.

The winners will be announced on the evening of 27 October at the awards ceremony held during the 2016 animago AWARD & CONFERENCE (Thursday 27 and Friday 28 October 2016) in Munich's Cultural Center GASTEIG. The animago will be celebrating its 20th anniversary this year, as well.

"We never cease to be amazed at the quality of the submissions we receive, even after 20 years of doing this", explains **Günter Hagedorn**, animago co-founder and head of the jury. "Once again this year we were sent countless amazing works by students, professional CG artists and private artists. One thing we noticed is the mixing of different technologies, such as stop motion, 2D animation and 2D typography and 3D animation, which seems to have established itself as a new form of expression. We are also delighted about the high level of international participation, for example by artists from Puerto Rico and Libya. We're very excited and wish all the nominees the best of luck!"
